1. GENERAL INFORMATION

This bulletin provides information about the Scholarships for Academic Excellence (SAE) to be awarded in 2024 for the 2023-2024 academic year. *Pending the appropriation of State funds during the 2024 session of the New York State Legislature*, 8,000 scholarships will be awarded. Of the 8,000 awards, 2,000 scholarships will have a value of \$1,500 each and 6,000 scholarships will have a value of \$500 each. Winners of this scholarship may concurrently receive any other New York State academic or general award for which he or she may be eligible. However, winners cannot be awarded a Scholarship for Academic Excellence in any amount when the combination of all awards would exceed their cost of attendance. *Scholarship winners must attend a college or university (SAE's cannot be used for trade schools) in New York State. 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- 2. The student's permanent home is outside of NYS and the student is or has **ONE** of the following:
 - a. U.S. citizen
 - b. Permanent lawful resident
 - c. Of a class of refugees paroled by the attorney general under his or her parole authority pertaining to the admission of aliens to the U.S.
 - d. <u>U-Visa</u>
 - e. <u>T-Visa</u>
 - f. <u>Temporary protected status</u>, pursuant to the Federal Immigration Act of 1990
 - g. <u>Without lawful immigration status</u> (including those with DACA status)
 - h. AND you meet ONE of the following criteria:
 - i. You attended a NYS high school for 2 or more years, graduated from a NYS high school, and are applying for an award for undergraduate study at a NYS college within *five* years of receiving your NYS high school diploma *OR*
 - ii. You attended a NYS high school for 2 or more years, graduated from a NYS high school, and are applying for an award for graduate study at a NYS college within *ten* years of receiving your NYS high school diploma *OR*
 - iii.

4. ALLOCATION OF SCHOLARSHIPS TO THE HIGH SCHOOLS

- A. Each registered high school in the State, as defined in the Regulations of the Commissioner, will be allocated a single scholarship of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.)
- B.
